- AMCMC A written report was submitted by Vogel. 2 private runs will take place on Oct 31 and Dec 5. There will be no public runs until later in 2021. The Board also discussed a new draft ACHS RRCHS Joint Venture Agreement which dissolves the Management Committee and transfers operation and maintenance to an entity newly named The Amador Central Railroad Corporation. Several points were brought up that will be reworked in the next draft that will be submitted at the next Board meeting.
- **EVENTS** The Annual Dinner is scheduled to take place at Teresa's on 11/1/20 with a maximum of 40 guests with only a few remaining reservations left.
- KENNEDY MINE FOUNDATION The Kennedy is doing no public tours for the remainder of the
 year, but is instead focusing on completing the Model Mine Tunnel and Gift Shop. Tours will
 resume in the spring.

NEW BUSINESS: John James mentioned that the River Valley Times at Slough House would be a good outlet for placing announcements and advertising. McGowen will contact the editor.
